lem of mobility of labor in Britain is to "encourage" it by control of fuel and other key materials, it was learned today.

"Direction" of labor is politically impossible, because it means industrial conscription. So it is to be done indirectly; people can be led but not driven.

For example, if in any town there is a cotton spinning mill and a factory making electric radiators, and if the country wants cotton yarn and does not want electric radiators, then the mill will get fuel and materials and the factory will not; and labor, if it wants to work at all, can go to the place where it has something to work on.

**LABOR MOBILITY**

Mobility and self-discipline of labor are Britain's root problems in tackling her production crisis. The fuel crisis and other bottlenecks can be smashed one by one, to get near to full employment, though it is doubtful whether a free society can ever quite get there.
