

TWO WERE KILLED

Disastrous Collision at Shawinigan Junction

Montreal, June 6.—Further details of the train accident at Shawinigan Junction show that the special train in charge of Conductor Dicare ran into an engine engaged in shunting at Shawinigan Junction yard. Brakeman A. Desjardines was killed instantaneously and Fireman A. Doyer was so seriously injured that he died shortly after the accident. No details as to the cause of the accident, which will form the subject of an official investigation and a coroner's inquest, have yet come to hand. Engineers of the train, locomotive and shunting engine escaped without hurt. Both engines were smashed up, and several cars were badly damaged. The line was blocked for many hours with the wreckage, but was cleared for traffic this morning. The two men who lost their lives were residents of Montreal.
