DANGERS OF THE RAIL.

A G.T.R. Locomotive Suspended
in the Air.

A FATAL COLLISION.

BRAMPTON, Jan. 25.—At about 2:30 this afternoon as a down stock train was running through the station yard, on a siding, to let the up train pass on the main line, a coupling gave way letting the engine and four or five cars attached loose without a brakeman, and the switch being open for the up train they ran off the track and the front part of the engine went over the side of the iron bridge which spans Main street, where it now hangs suspended about thirty feet from the ground with the cowcatcher and front wheels torn off and very much damaged. Fortunately no one was hurt. A gang of men is now engaged clearing the track. The down train and up passenger trains transferred passengers and baggage.

TRENTON, N. Y., Jan. 25. — A freight train standing at Tullytown, this morning, was run into by another freight train. David James, fireman, was killed, and Byron Wright, conductor, was injured and died after the amputation of his leg.
